 Most children will cope well with these and become accustomed to the initial changes after a few weeks. However we recognise that some children need more support and guidance than others and our pastoral team is here to support you and your child, especially in the first few months.

# Supporting Your Child To Establish A Good Routine

- If possible be around for the first day or two to offer a helping hand in the morning.
- Encourage a night-time routine, packing bags, getting uniform ready and getting bus fare ready etc. Some children will need help packing books for quite some time, having a copy of their timetable can help you to support them with reminders.
- Read through the planner with them it has all the rules and instructions, advice on systems like lost property.
- Agree a routine for homework that fits in with family life. Your support and encouragement will help to ease any worries about homework. You know your child best. Some will need more help than others.
- An established routine from the start paves the way for effective independent behaviour in the future.

#### Homework


- No homework for the first two weeks

#### Registration/Attendance/Absence

- Daily registration at 8.30am.
- Please contact the school reception if your child is unwell or going to be late. Students arriving late will receive late marks
- Unconfirmed absences lead to a parental text/email home allowing us to follow up potential safeguarding issues.

- If a student needs to leave school early for any reason write a note in the planner and collect your son/daughter from reception where you must sign out.
- IMPORTANT: The Head teacher cannot grant leave of absence in term time unless exceptional circumstances

## Attendance Targets

- Good attendance is considered to be 95% and above
- The pastoral team will make interventions when a student's attendance falls below 90%
- There are usually entirely legitimate reasons for such absences and we want to work together to help support students and parents in these circumstances



#### Uniform

- Uniform guidelines for boys / girls has been included in the parent pack. They are also listed in the student planner.
- We have high expectations for school uniform and how students wear it.
- School uniform stockists have displays tonight in the dining room.



#### Parent Clarification - Skirts

- Either a knee-length straight black skirt with a small vent at the back for movement, or a plain black knee-length skirt with box pleats or a black knee length A line skirt.
- Close fitting or stretchy material is not permitted.
   Whichever skirt is chosen the height from the top of
   the patella (knee cap) to the bottom of the skirt
   should be a maximum of 2.5 cms.



## Reading: KS3 Reading Log

- We encourage students to keep a record of their reading in their log.
- ➤ Title/author of the book
- comments about what has happened (developments in plot/character).
- We would like parents to take an active role in encouraging our students to read (especially the reluctant ones).
   Parents can sign and add comments to the Reading Log.
- In September, the English teacher and/or form tutor may set a homework that requires students to read a certain amount each week. This may vary from teacher to teacher.
- A greater frequency and depth of reading is essential in developing higher level literacy skills therefore helping students to improve the quality of their extended writing.


## Reading: Completing Book Reviews

- Students can complete book reviews and those that do will be awarded points based on the quality of these.
- ➤ House competition.
- The points also contribute to the Readerboard (a way of celebrating individual reading success)
- Please refer to the leaflet 'Submitting an outstanding book review' for more details. Students will receive more guidance about how to do this in September, however if students wish to produce a book review (or several!) over summer, they can do so (please save any reviews to a word document until September when students will know more about submitting reviews).
- Parents can take home a Reading Log tonight (available in the dining room)

## Y7 & 8 Science



- We are following 'Activate Science' course.
- This is a very challenging course.
- We are promoting a 'Growth Mindset' amongst our students.
- We want to develop our students into resilient and independent learners.
- They are learning to think, question, analyse, apply, evaluate.
- Students will have a test after each topic (approx. 3-4 weeks). The
  tests are challenging and require application of the concepts taught.
  They are not just recall. Students are not expected to achieve full
  marks.
- Some tests are harder than others and you can get an indication of the level from the grading 'developing', 'secure', 'extending'.
- Our current year 10 students who followed this course display a more positive approach to learning than older years. They are more willing to 'have a go' and puzzle over things. They use a greater range of study skills and exhibit more independence in managing their learning.



#### How you can support your child in Science?

- All students will have access to Kerboodle on line resources.
- If they forget their logon details they must speak to their science teacher.
- In preparing for tests they can use the following resources:
- Exercise books Topic booklets The last lesson of each topic is a revision lesson Kerboodle on line resources: Text book- read each double page spread and summary questions - Chapter summary key points - End of chapter question Powerpoints and worksheets from each lesson Interactives and animations A practice multiple choice test for each topic. After each test the class will go through each question in detail and will write corrections on their papers in green pen.
