My Summer Book: The Boy on the Wooden Box. By Leon Leyson

Leon was only 10 when the Nazis invaded Poland and his family was forced to relocate to the Krakow ghetto. With incredible luck, perseverance, and grit, Leyson was able to survive the Nazis. Ultimately, it was the generosity and cunning of one man, a man named Oskar Schindler, who saved Leon Leyson's life, and the lives of his mother, his father, and two of his four siblings, by adding their names to his list of workers in his factory—a list that became world renowned: Schindler's List. Leon was the youngest person Schindler saved. He needed to be in a wooden box in order to work the machinery in Schindler's factory.
