Our students share our high aspirations for their futures and are challenged and supported by our dedicated teaching and support staff to achieve their ambitions.


We embrace and celebrate our wide ethnic and geographical diversity, striving to ensure that each child feels valued and participates actively in our school community.

ASPIRATION AND CHALLENGE

Crossley Heath expects high standards of achievement and we are very proud when our students regularly excel. Our students consistently achieve a host of top grades at GCSE, allowing the pursuit of their preferred A Level courses. We regularly feature in The Times list of the top 150 schools in the country and our students go on to secure places at prestigious universities, as well as positions in reputable and internationally renowned companies. We are committed to making your child's education a fulfilling, exciting and rewarding experience. Our curriculum is designed to enable students to achieve academic excellence whilst also developing personal skills and strong core values for future happiness, success and learning. We provide a broad, balanced curriculum both traditional and forward thinking in content and delivery and underpinned by a strong academic ethos. In the lower school all students study a full range of subjects and make their GCSE choices before the end of Key Stage 3 during Year 9. At Key Stage 4

students study Mathematics, English Language and English Literature, three sciences, a Modern Foreign Language (French or German) and a humanities subject (Geography, History or Religious Studies) together with additional GCSE option subjects. Crossley Heath is delighted to be part of the prestigious Mandarin Excellence Programme from Year 7 and these students continue the study of Mandarin Chinese as part of the programme up to GSCE level. All students have weekly Personal Development lessons which equip students with the skills and knowledge necessary to navigate modern day society.

Our teachers are highly qualified specialists who are passionate about their subjects and ensure that students are challenged, inquisitive and questioning. Lessons are taught at pace and excellent use is made of technology to support learning. Academic progress is monitored closely to ensure that all students make excellent progress in their learning. Positive relationships between staff and students also support students' learning. By developing a strong ethos of hard work, students become independent learners, able to go out into the world of work with the skills, determination and resilience to succeed.

Each student is also welcomed into one of our Houses – Kings, Queens, Porter or Savile. The Houses, led by our sixth form House Captains, comprise members from across all year groups and staff. The House system provides further opportunities for making friends across the school. It provides challenge and excitement throughout the year in the form of competitions including sports, drama, music, reading, debating, chess and quizzes. Students often comment that House activities are one of the highlights of their time at school.

We want your children, our students, to feel cared for, valued and supported to enjoy their learning and to achieve their potential. As such, we care very much for the wellbeing and health of each of them. A particular focus is our drive on ensuring positive mental health and wellbeing which can be difficult for some young people to navigate during adolescent years. Our growth mindset approach enables students to understand that although something cannot be achieved immediately, it should not become a barrier to success in the future with the appropriate attitude and application. The school's pastoral systems provide excellent care guidance and support.

Our SEN, Pastoral and Wellbeing teams are able to offer effective and compassionate support tailored to the needs of our students. Our Student Healthcare Assistant provides excellent care for students with first aid and individual medical health needs. Our Pastoral leaders work with vulnerable children and their families to ensure they receive support and help to overcome barriers to enable them to achieve to their full potential. The SEN, Pastoral and Wellbeing teams adopt a holistic approach to the welfare of our young people, including the learning, physical and emotional needs of students. 98% of our parents tell us that the school offers a safe and happy environment in which to learn.





A culture of respect for each other and a positive approach to diversity and inclusion is embedded in everything we do. All members of our community are encouraged to respect differences and challenge discrimination and inequality, including bullying. We actively encourage all our students to be kind and respectful in their interactions, both in and outside of the classroom. We focus heavily on high standards of behaviour and routines

are a key element of that. Students know with certainty what is expected and this leads to a calm, positive atmosphere and climate.

We embrace and celebrate diversity in a variety of ways from activities within the curriculum to assemblies, extra curricula and special celebration days such as an annual Diversity Day, themed food days and fundraising charity events. We promote the values of respect, self-belief, purpose,

personal responsibility, challenge and aspiration. WIDER OPPORTUNITIES

We believe that every student should have the opportunity to be extraordinary, not only by developing academically, but through a whole range of experiences they gain during their time at Crossley Heath. Many of these experiences stay with our young people for a lifetime. These include visits to the battlefields of Belgium, studying volcanos and glaciers in

Iceland, field trips to support Biology, residential activity and reward trips and taking part in exchange visits and the Duke of Edinburgh and National Citizenship programmes. Many more local visits take place to enhance the curriculum, to develop independence and personal growth, and to encourage the discovery of new talents.



Enrichment activities add a further vital dimension to the life of the school. Crossley Heath has a strong sporting heritage and encourages all students, of whatever ability or experience, to enjoy physical activities and team sports. These include cross-country, netball, cricket, rugby union, athletics, football, table-tennis, tennis and badminton and yoga, to name a few. We promote fitness and opportunity for all and we have well-equipped facilities to support these activities. Your child will be encouraged to find their niche - whatever their interests and abilities are – there is something for everyone!

We value the importance of music for young people and our aim is that all students will participate in some musical activity, including learning to play an instrument. A range of individual instrumental tuition is available. Students have thoroughly enjoyed our music tours abroad and visits to concerts and theatres. In addition to the formal school activities such as the annual Prize Giving event, Students have the opportunity to showcase their skills and perform at many in-school events including assemblies, charity events and House competitions.

SIXTH FORM & BEYOND

We expect that students joining us in Year 7 will stay with us for seven years, joining our sixth form community. We also welcome into our Sixth Form many new students from schools across a wide geographical area. Our provision in the Sixth Form offers academic excellence, exceptional pastoral care and a wealth of opportunities, not only within the curriculum but also from an extensive enrichment programme. A significant proportion of our students go on to prestigious universities, including Oxford and Cambridge and Russell Group universities. We are able to offer personalised support and advice on UCAS applications and student finance options. We are also extremely proud of our 100% success rate in students gaining entry to the university of their choice. However, whilst the majority of students do choose to go on

to university, we actively support alternative pathways for students to explore, including the increasingly popular higher level and degree level apprenticeships which have provided a viable and equally successful alternative route for some of our students.

We very much hold the view that our sixth formers are role models of our school as well as the leaders of our future who remember the school with fondness. Our developing alumni contacts help give advice and opportunities for our students to experience.
