Bronze Award – Leadership Activity Indicators

The following activities are examples of student leadership activities that can meet the bronze award level. This is not an exhaustive list. Applicants should demonstrate a long term commitment to the Student Leadership Programme in order to gain the award. Applicants will strengthen the evidence they present to moderation if they have engaged in a number of these activities. Applicants must complete their Student Leadership Accreditation – Evidence Log and submit this for moderation in the Summer Term (submission dates will be published by Mr Davis)

- Contribution towards and serving at a charity bake sale
- Supporting any other charity activities by following the instructions of a member of staff/other student leader
- Helping at a school community event (such as Diwali/Vaisakhi/Eid/Pride) by following the leadership instructions given by a member of staff/other student leader
- Being a part of a student panel for new staff interviews
- Making a poster to advertise an event
- Helping at a parent information evening (but not making a speech)
- Being a role model for positive behaviour and being a positive bystander in school (in the classroom, during other times in the school day)
- Attending any offered student leadership training events
- Regular and consistent attendance at student leadership meetings
- Contributing to student voice activities that support the continued improvement of our school (this may come in the form of surveys, attending student voice meetings with staff of visitors
- Involvement in other student leadership and volunteering activities such as Eco-Club or Duke of Edinburgh bronze award
