



# Silver Award – Leadership Activity Indicators

**The following activities are examples of student leadership activities that can meet the silver award level. This is not an exhaustive list. Applicants should demonstrate a long term commitment to the Student Leadership Programme in order to gain the award. Applicants will strengthen the evidence they present to moderation if they have engaged in a number of these activities. Applicants must complete their Student Leadership Accreditation – Evidence Log and submit this for moderation in the Summer Term**  
**(submission dates will be published by Mr Davis)**

- Taking a leading role in ensuring that a charity activity runs successfully by communicating effectively with members of staff/other student leaders
- Taking on a leadership role in organising a school community event (such as Diwali/Vaisakhi/Eid/Pride) by communicating effectively with members of staff/other student leaders
- Being a part of a student leadership group that makes a presentation to external agencies/visitors
- Being responsible for effective communication about student leadership activities (this may include doing tutorial presentations, assemblies or other methods of communication)
- Making a speech at a parent information evening
- Being a role model for positive behaviour and being a positive bystander in school (in the classroom, during other times in the school day)
- Attending any offered student leadership training events
- Regular and consistent attendance at student leadership meetings
- Increasing involvement in other student leadership and volunteering activities such as subject mentoring, Duke of Edinburgh silver award or leading sports activities at school
- Demonstrating consistent and effective leadership skills that go beyond Bronze Level
